Methodology

Fieldwork Dates

18th February – 15th March 2019

Data Collection Method

The survey was generally conducted via telephone. A combination of both landline and mobile data were called. Additional respondents were invited to take part in the survey online. Invitations and two reminders were sent out to these respondents via email.

Population Sampled

All residents aged 18+ in Great Britain who identify as Jewish.

Sample Size

757

Sampling Method

Data called were members of a pre-recruited Survation panel of Jewish residents in the UK. When joining the panel, respondents were asked to confirm whether they identified as Jewish (including secular or non-practicing) and only those who did were continued into the survey.

Data Weighting

Data were weighted to the profile of all Jewish adults aged 18+ in Great Britain. Data were weighted by age, sex and region. Targets for the weighted data were derived from Office of National Statistics 2011 Census data

Margin of Error

Because only a sample of the full population was interviewed, all results are subject to margin of error, meaning that not all differences are statistically significant. For example, in a question where 50% (the worst case scenario as far as margin of error is concerned) gave a particular answer, with a sample of 757 it is 95% certain that the 'true' value will fall within the range of 3.6% from the sample result. Subsamples from the cross-breaks will be subject to higher margin of error, conclusions drawn from crossbreaks with very small sub-samples should be treated with caution.

Question presentation

All data tables shown in full below, in order and wording put to respondents, including but not limited to all tables relating to published data and all relevant tables preceding them. Tables for demographic questions might not be included but these should be clear from the cross-breaks on published tables. In all questions where the responses are a list of parties, names or statements, these will typically have been displayed to respondents in a randomising order. The only questions which would not have had randomising responses would be those in which there was a natural order to maintain – e.g. a scale from “strongly agree” to “strongly disagree”, a list of numbers from 0 to 10 or questions which had factual rather than opinion-related answers such as demographic information. “Other”, “Don't know” and “Refused” responses are not randomised.

Not all questions will have necessarily been asked to all respondents – this is because they may be follow-on questions from previous questions or only appropriate to certain demographic groups. Lower response counts should make clear where this has occurred.

Data were analysed and weighted by Suration.
